

HUBS of Care - Results are in!

Hubs of Care aims to incorporate health care providers from other settings within the Hemodialysis (HD) unit.

1. Performed an environmental scan to identify need and desire for different healthcare providers in HD centres across Canada.
2. Administered 487 surveys and entered and analyzed data from most partner sites (encountering inevitable delays with COVID-19 slowing down research and then a bottleneck once things opened back up again).



- Awaiting results from Vancouver
- Results from 6 sites (Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton, Toronto, Montreal and Halifax).
- Majority of patients and healthcare providers in favour of bringing other providers into the HD unit

Both patients and healthcare providers prioritize diabetes, foot care, mental health care specialist and primary care practitioners.

- Patients also prioritized cardiology; providers prioritized diabetes care.
- In-person care was preferred, but virtual care was acceptable to some.


Can-SOLVE CKD 2.0: Mental health concerns for people receiving hemodialysis are much higher than the general population. Mental health concerns are also undertreated for hemodialysis patients.



Building on the work of Triple I, we have submitted a proposal to Can-SOLVE CKD 2.0 Grant Application which aims to identify and address mental health care gaps for patients on in-centre Hemodialysis.

LENA- Hemodialysis Education APP *By patients for patients'*

- Preliminary testing complete
- Aim to include most relevant information
- Moving into next phase: adding content to app before trialing with patients
